Vessel Safety Check (VSC) Update

As of now, we have accomplished 30 vessel safety checks. That includes 16 at Convair Sailing, where **P/C Doug Bass, SN-IN** officiated.

Our VEs for the record are: **D/C Allan Bombard, JN** (newly minted VE, congratulations!), Jon Coats (recovering from a knee replacement), **P/C Bob Gibbs, JN** (re-enlisted), **Lt Michael Philbrook, JN**, **Tanya Weiner, AP**, and myself as Ch/VSC.

The VSC Process: Exams are initiated on receiving a VSC request, I notify the requester that our Vessel Examiners (VEs) have been notified to contact the requester, and the first one to do so notifies the rest of the group. All VEs notified respond to my notification whether or not they can do the exam. This so we don't leave a requester not knowing the status of his case.

To date we haven't had to leave a request unattended! I have stepped in when no other VE applied. My thinking on this is that it is a black eye to the squadron when we can't fulfill our duty as VEs. However, I will not be able to do that many more, owing to my physical increasing limitations (without actually demonstrating how to extract a VE from the water). 
### **Treasurer's Report**

First, all of our Club invoices from National have been paid. The California State sales tax for the year ending has been submitted and accepted.


ere's some information on 2023 Dues.

#### **MARITIME LAW CORNER**

America's Boating Club® is a registered trademark of the United States Power Squadrons, a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization dedicated to boating safety and education. Your San Diego

Sail and Power Squadron ("SDSPS") is one of the many America's Boating Club® squadrons. Your SDSPS is also a 501(c)(3) non-profit corporation which is incorporated in California. By way of a request from America's Boating Club® (National) your SDSPS is now operating under the name America's Boating Club® - San Diego. We retain the same non-profit corporate structure but will be doing business as America's Boating Club® - San Diego.

#### **Update on the Proposed CARB Rules**

In our last issue I wrote about the concerns of many in the sportfishing industry and other sea tourism businesses regarding the California Air and Resources Board's (CARB) proposed engine emission rules and repowering requirements. After significant opposition to CARB's proposed engine emission reduction and re-

powering rules, CARB held a virtual meeting with industry stakeholders on March 24, 2022, wherein an alternative, amended plan was proposed by CARB that would not cause the significant economic harm to small business owners and others that make their livelihood from their vessels.

The new plan would still require a vast majority of commercial vessels to re-power to lower emission engines but proposes a more realistically achievable schedule for implementation of those lower emission engines and only when the engine technology becomes available, is economically feasible, and safe.

The new plan will require vessel owners to install upgraded Tier 3 engines by January 1, 2025 and Tier 4 engines with Diesel Particulate Filters (DPFs) by 2035, giving them 12 years to comply. You may recall from my previous post that while DPFs are used in commercial trucks, many have argued that they are not safe in the confined engine rooms on vessels, and a boat cannot simply pull over to the side of the road if there is a fire.



Finally, under the new plan, if the mandated technologies are not available or safe, CARB will work with vessel owners to consider alternative technologies and revised compliance timelines.



#### New Regulations for Small Passenger Vessels After the Conception Fire

In our last issue I also wrote about the civil and criminal proceedings in the aftermath of the deadly *Conception* fire off the Ventura County coast. As you may recall, 34 passengers perished in the *Conception* dive boat fire during the early morning hours of September 2, 2019. Five crew members survived. The captain of the *Conception* has been charged with manslaughter and civil lawsuits are in the works, including lawsuits against the Coast Guard.

On March 21, 2022 a congressional hearing was held wherein Federal lawmakers met with Rear Adm. John Mauger, of the U.S. Coast Guard, and National Transportation Safety Board Chair Jennifer Homendy to assess the progress of implementing new regulations for small vessels spurred by the *Conception* dive boat fire.

The National Transportation Safety Board recommended in its investigation of the *Conception* fire that the Coast Guard require boat owners to install more comprehensive smoke detector systems, upgrade emergency exits and make mandatory inspection checks on roving watches, after which Congress mandated\_that the Coast Guard review its rules and regulations for small passenger vessels.

The subject of the March 21 congressional hearing was the Small Passenger Vessel Safety Act, which became law in January 2021. At the March 21, 2022 hearing, Rep. Salud Carbajal, D-Santa Barbara, who chairs the House Subcommittee on Coast Guard and Maritime Transportation, took the Coast Guard to task for the slow implementation of regulations laid out in the Small Passenger Vessel Safety Act. Although the Small Passenger Vessel Safety Act became law more than a year ago, the Coast Guard did not publish any new rules for small vessels until December of 2021, and those rules have yet to take effect.

Rear Adm. Mauger assured the parties at the hearing that the Coast Guard's new rules for fire protection on small passenger vessels will take effect March 28, 2022. "These rules substantially increase the safety of small passenger vessels by requiring increased fire detection, increased fire suppression, improved means of escape, safer handling of flammable items, additional crew training and monitoring of night watches on board vessels," Mauger said.

The new rules do not apply to ferries or fishing vessels.

#### Lessons Learned from the US Coast Guard - 2022

### SAFETY LESSONS FROM THE US COAST GUARD – April

One quarter of the year has passed, it is spring, and once the weather starts to cooperate, we can truly let the boating season take over our lives. My wife and I had a chance to cruise, from San Diego to the Mexican Riviera, with Holland America Line, and we had a great time. Together with my friend P/D/C Steve Abbott, SN, we were

allowed to teach a session on how to use a sextant, and how to calculate your latitude by meridian transit. I know, this is an old skill, maybe not necessary in this age with electronic gadgets, but we had a lot of fun. The cruise line made a classroom available, and every seat was occupied. If you ever need an intellectual challenge, then give this a try.

We also said goodbye to a dear friend, Patrick Attardo, who lost his battle with brain cancer. The land ceremony was held on St. Patrick's Day, so we celebrated his wonderful life on the same day and time, on the top deck looking aft, leaving the ocean and our memories in the wind. Patrick's warm energy, and his heroic effort to master celestial navigation in some of my classes, will be in my mind for a long time to come. He was my hero!

At last month's challenge, we looked at the rules for Maneuvering and Warning Signals. This particular challenge, for INLAND only, indicates an intention, almost like in Inland waters the captain says to another vessel: this is what I like to do, what do you think? So, my question was: Two vessels are meeting on a clear day and will pass less than a one-half mile apart. What is the whistle signal requirement? The correct answer "C" can be found in the USCG Navigation Rules 34 (a), unless (h) applies. Signals must be exchanged if agreements have not been made by radio. In 34 (a) the term is shall, and in 34 (h) the term is not obliged by using the radiotelephone.

The challenge here is one where INTERNATIONAL and INLAND Rules <u>significantly differ</u>. Just look it up: for INLAND there is an extensive section under Rule 34 (a) that dictates how to respond to a signal, while there is nothing on how to respond in INTERNATIONAL waters. My reading: *feel free to respond if it increases safety*.

For this month's challenge, let's look at another difference between INTERNATIONAL and INLAND, the "special flashing light". Again, you need to look this up in the Rules to get it right. So, my question is: Which is a characteristic of a "special flashing light"?

- A It must be yellow in color.
- B It must be placed as far forward as possible.
- C It must not show through an arc of more than 225 degrees.
- D All of the above.

I hope you find the one correct answer in the Navigation Rules & Regulations Handbook, and that you let me know. I also hope that you make plans to take a course from our Americas Boating Club Oceanside. There is an excellent Engine Maintenance class coming up in April.
